## A Letter from Erik Ewertz, Senior Warden

Father David reports from Switzerland that he and Janet have settled into the apartment provided for them and are becoming acclimated to city life. Father David is consulting the IPC Church of Zurich whom face similar challenges as we face here at All Saints'. Our rector sends his best to everyone and promises he won't let them wear him out.

On the home front, the newly formed Stewardship Committee has been meeting monthly to discern All Saints' financial situation and provide recommendations to the Vestry. The committee was selected from church members who are financially astute and relatively young, as they will inherit the stewardship of the church. Both Father David and I have attended many meetings of the group and are pleased with the committee's progress. The committee has been asked to make its recommendations at the September Vestry meeting. Please pray for discernment and wisdom for this very important committee.

Last month, John Druhan and I attended the Diocesan Stewardship Conference held at Saint John's Episcopal Church in Ellicott City. Representatives from All Saints' are required to attend this conference as part of the agreement for our Diocesan Pledge reduction. We received some valuable information that we will share with the Stewardship Committee at their next meeting. Father Charles Cloughen, who moderated the conference and who has preached at All Saints' several times, spoke about his coin philosophy. This philosophy embraces the idea that one side of the coin is Stewardship, the other side is Evangelism, and the edge is Education. In order for All Saints' to become a fully healthy parish, we must engage ourselves in all three aspects of the coin. To accomplish this task, we will need to increase giving, educate ourselves about giving, and attract more people to fill the pews. To that end, please pray that the Lord will raise up people to form an Evangelism Committee.

# From the Parish Archives

"AND THY SAINTS..."

How many individual windows are there in All Saints' Church? Would you guess 20?, 30?, 35?, 40? By actual count, not including the basement and narthex, there are 30 windows in this 121-year-old structure. Some of them we take for granted – but seven we cannot ignore on a typical Sunday morning. As we face the chancel, the seven angel windows in the apse are always in view.

Thirteen years ago, "From the Archives" featured a profile of our historic windows. Crafted by William Keyser's cousin Sarah Whitman (they both died in 1904), these artistic gems lend a special beauty to our "country church." Some have been in place since 1891, while others – designated memorials – have been altered over the years.

The question which no one asks, however, is WHY the inscription in the chancel windows? They read - one word per window – AND THY SAINTS GIVE THANKS UNTO THEE. Recent research, we are pleased to announce, has solved the puzzle.

Ms. Whitman was apparently familiar with the Book of Psalms, for she borrowed the words from one particular translation of Psalm 145:

- 8 The LORD is gracious and merciful; long-suffering, and of great goodness.
- 9 The LORD is loving unto every man; and his mercy is over all his works.
- 10 All thy works praise thee, O LORD; and thy saints give thanks unto thee.
- 11 They show the glory of thy kingdom, and talk of thy power.

Psalm 145, it can be said, is truly our church's special hymn of praise. July 29, The Ninth Sunday after Pentecost, is designated as the appropriate day for the reading of alternate Psalm 145.



# Stewardship Corner

This month I would like to talk about the importance of giving to the general fund. All of us enjoy giving to the various ministries, especially the youth oriented activities. I feel the same way, often designating money for specific areas.

The general fund however, is money designated for our day-to- day operation. BGE, Verizon, salaries, etc. all must be taken care of each and every month. The Vestry has pared these operational expenses down as far as possible without cutting staff.


This tour features a short train ride between the two locations. And, between visits, enjoy lunch at a nearby Irish pub.
